

Ordinance #10

Regulating the erection of "Stop" signs and traffic at intersections.

Be it hereby enacted and ordained by the Borough of Deer Lake, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania, in Council assembled, and it is hereby enacted and ordained as follows:

Section 1.

It shall be lawful for the Borough to designate through highways by erecting at the entrance thereto from intersecting highways signs bearing the word "STOP" shall be in letters of at least six (6) inches in height and the bottom of the signs shall be at a height of approximately eight (8) feet above the surface of the highway.

Section 2.

It shall be unlawful for the driver or operator of any vehicle, before entering a through highway, to fail to come to a full stop, within a reasonable distance, before entering the intersection on such through highway, when an official "STOP" sign or signs have been erected in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance.

Penalty.

Anyone violating the provisions of Section 2 of this ordinance shall upon summary conviction before a magistrate shall be sentenced to pay a fine of five (\$5.00) Dollars and costs of prosecution and, in default of the payment therefore, shall undergo imprisonment for not more than three (3) days.

Ordained and enacted into an ordinance this 11th day of August, 1953.
